


# Coordination and cooperation across programmes

# Outlines

During the events organised by Interact it was concluded that coordination and cooperation among Interreg programmes and beyond is not yet a daily practice but rather an exception. Therefore in late 2016 Interact invited few Interreg programmes to come together and work on developing and describing different coordination and cooperation activities.

Throughout these month the group of Interreg programmes (Task Force) developed descriptions of activities for four coordination and cooperation levels (options), clarifying and providing for each of the descriptions: objectives, activities (ideas) on how the coordination and cooperation is/ could be implemented, benefits and difficulties, sharing experiences as well as defining open issues/questions for improvement, especially post 2020.

For capitalisation purposes, transferability and roll-out of Interreg project results, as well as with aiming at integrated territorial development - coordination and cooperation with European Structural and Investment Funds programmes and directly managed EU wide programmes is of great interest for Interreg.

Taking into account above said, the upcoming extended Task Force meeting will invite some of the EU wide programmes and Interreg Europe programme to discuss how coordination and cooperation between these programmes and Interreg programmes could be improved. Based on Interreg programmes' experiences some open issues will be raised for the discussion.

More specifically, questions we wish to address during the meeting are:

- How to improve exchange between Interreg and EU wide programmes, should contact/coordination agents be appointed in relevant Interreg and EU wide programmes?
- How to build complementarities between Interreg and EU wide programmes' projects? How could programmes better contribute to integrated territorial development?
- What agreements and processes are missing to build coordination and cooperation throughout project life cycle? To what extent programmes can support 'project chain' development?

The meeting will address operational questions of coordination and cooperation without going to specific thematic issues. However, innovation is selected as thematic interlink across programmes for this meeting.

## **Objective**

The aim of the meeting is to discuss how coordination and cooperation between Interreg programmes and EU wide programmes, such as Horizon 2020, LIFE could be improved now and in post 2020 period.
