## How does the strategy work?

- 1) Applicants included Capitalisation in their proposals
- 2) 54 approved projects grouped into 12 Thematic Poles
- 3) For each pole: 1 project + 1 EUSDR PAC -> Pole leaders

4) Roadmap created by each Pole -> Identified synergies + Foreseen

5) CommunicationSynergies -> Capitalisation

- **6) Dynamic nature** of the poles
- 7) Open to other programmes
  - -> Invitation email sent








## Analysis of the 1st year implementation

- Method: Online survey to Pole leaders, project partners and PACs
- <u>Results</u>: Positive direction of Poles and strong cooperation with EUSDR PACs
- Challenges: Definition of roles among involved actors and budgetary constraints
- > Solutions:
- CS Handbook: answers to actors' questions on CS implementation
- Meetings organised by JS
- Reallocation of project budget or include capitalisation budget (2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> call)
- Potential Capitalisation call?





## Capitalisation good practices

#### Thematic Poles 1, 2, 3

- Good commitment of PACs
- Cross-pole cooperation
- Identified synergies:
- Common deliverable "Bio-economy Policy Recommendation" to support EUSDR objectives
- Commonly reported outputs
- Summer school on social innovation
- ➤ **Joint meetings** with PACs/ stakeholders, joint participation to events: eg. Cross-fertilisation thematic WS Pole 1 with EUSDR PA7, PA8, PA9
- Involvement of other Interreg and EU-funded programmes
