What is Interreg Europ?

- 30 countries (EU 28, Switzerland & Norway)
- **359 MEUR** ERDF
- Emphasis on improving regional policies and programmes
- Focus on Investment for Growth and Jobs
- 2 interrelated actions: interregional cooperation projects + Policy Learning Platform

Why ask for advice?

- "interesting methods for analyzing citizens' initiatives in the field of research and innovation"



3. On-site peer review

Why request a peer review?

Receive recommendations from selected peers on possible approaches and solutions to a specific policy challenge – 2 day visit, up to 6 peers funded

When?

- First peer review requested by Hauts-de-France, taking place in Autumn 2018
- Call for interest launching soon (July) publicised through the community and through the Interreg Europe newsletter!



4. Submit good practices



Why submit a good practice to the good practice database?

- Expert validation before publication
- Give visibility to your project results
- Allow your good practices to be used during thematic events, peer reviews, advice given from expert helpdesk...




Why use the Knowledge Hub?
