




Agenda 23 – 24 October 2018 Sliema, Malta







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Outline

With this event we will take a close look at management verifications in Interreg from the unique perspectives of MA/JS and national controllers (FLC). On Day 1 members of MA/JS and national controllers will examine interfaces of their work and identify key factors for cooperation and more effective management verifications.

Day 2 will provide an opportunity to discuss hot topics and current issues related to management verifications such as new options provided by the Omnibus Regulation and a tentative perspective on post-2020 management verifications.

If you are a National Controller or a member of a Managing Authorities or Joint Secretariat dealing with management verifications, this event is for you!

Day 1

A well-tuned engine runs smoothly and sounds nicely – for those driving a car as well as for those being driven in it. Taking this metaphor to the Interreg world, one can consider MA, JS and National Control (FLC) as the engine in the management of cooperation programmes.

It goes without saying that task division, workflows, interfaces, and daily routines and proceedings of these bodies should be well-tuned.

Legal requirements in the current period will be the point of departure for a joint reflection on management verification practices and communication between MA, JS and National Control. Together we will explore options for managing cooperation, circulating information and creating a climate of mutual support and trust and tackle questions such as: What are the expectations and needs of the various bodies involved in management verifications? How to improve clarity of roles and responsibilities? How to avoid mistakes that could potentially turn into a critical issue harming programme implementation?

Day 2

On the second day we will take a close look at some of the current hot topics in management verifications. Following the approach of past Interact trainings and workshops on management verifications, the workshop will provide a mix of training and discussion sessions. Hot topics are likely to include verification of staff costs, risk-based sampling, new options provided by the Omnibus Regulations and management verifications post 2020. The workshop will provide a possibility to brainstorm on all topics with a focus on simplification and legal certainty.

Target group

This workshop is dedicated to experienced Interreg programmes' staff that is responsible for decision making processes in institution (heads of divisions/departments, deputy heads) from the Managing Authorities, Joint Secretariats and National control institutions (FLCs).

To keep the workshop effective, we need to limit the participation per programme/country/institution to a maximum of two persons.



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Participants are encouraged to contact Interact if they identify a topic on the agenda for which they would be willing to share their practice/experience through a presentation, as well as to propose other topics of interest.

Objectives

An overarching objective of this two-days meeting is to strengthen shared understanding and awareness related to task division as well as proceedings and routines between MA, JS and National Control (FLC).

The main operational objective of the meeting is to have the possibility to learn new practices and exchange experiences among participants. We would like to offer you the possibility to discuss what works, what doesn't and to learn from each other about good practices. Together with colleagues from other countries, participants will be able to identify common challenges in their daily work and share solutions and problem solving methods that can help increase the quality of work.

The key thematic objective is to understand the implications of the Omnibus Regulation and the draft legislative package for post 2020 for the work of National Control (FLC) but also for the MA and JS.

The workshop foresees active contributions from all participants and group work, with brief presentations to introduce topics or practices.
