We use variety of tools to make videos for:

- Thematic networks
- EC Day 66 videos
- Online learning platform
- Social media content
- Other





PowerPoint

Key features:

- You already have it
- You already know how to use it
- Just save your PPT as MP4 file
- Use for very short videos, with very little text



Pros:

- ✓ Very easy and intuitive
- Full customisation of fonts and colours
- ✓ Easy to edit, collaborate and exchange

Cons:

- Only text and 2D graphics no footage
- × Only for short videos can get boring



Biteable

Key features:

- Find it here: https://biteable.com
- Incredibly simple to use templates
- No download needed
- Great for "explainer" videos



Pros:

- ✓ Very easy to use
- Audio library great selection
- ✓ Very rich collection of templates
- ✓ Easy share on social media

Cons:

- Templates restrict editing options
- × Cannot download in free version
- × Cannot upload your own footage in free



Screencast-o-matic

Key features:

- Records activity on screen screencasts
- Find it here: screencast-o-matic.com
- Need to download and install + Google log in
- · Great tool for making tutorials.



Pros:

- ✓ Very user friendly
- Record Screen and/or Webcam
- ✓ Trimming tool integrated in free version
- ✓ Save on desktop or publish on YouTube

Cons:

- × Limited to 15 min. recordings in free
- No sound recording in free version



Blackmagic Design - DaVinci Resolve

Key features:

- Great alternative to Adobe Premiere
- Need to download and install:

www.blackmagicdesign.com/products/davinciresolve

Loads of professional features



Pros:

- Free version includes tools for: editing, visual effects, motion graphics, colour correction and audio post production
- Not hard to learn for basic needs

Cons:

Takes some effort to learn

Technique for making a script for longer tutorial videos:

- 1. Use "Dictate" option in "Microsoft Office Word", and speak freely about what you want to show/teach/present.
- 2. The "Dictate" will turn your speech into a messy text edit it
- 3. Run the revised text through "Resoomer"
- 4. Run the text through "Grammarly"
- 5. Fine tune as needed





1. Make sure you need a video

- What is the goal?
- Is a video the best tool for that goal?
- Consider other communication tools





2. Keep it short

- One clear message (sign up, visit event)
- From a few seconds to a few minutes
- If you need more time, use other tools





3. Avoid "talking heads"


- You know, boring interviews
- Consider summaries, with quotes
- Use video to "SHOW" something (not talk about something)





4. Don't overuse stock materials

- Stock can make video look generic
- Stock often doesn't fit
- You can make better yourself





- 5. Choose the right music and visuals
 - Fitting for the message
 - Not distracting
 - Carefully edited





- 1. Make sure you NEED a video
- 2. Keep it SHORT up to 2 minutes
- 3. Avoid "talking heads"
- 4. Don't overuse stock footage
- 5. Choose the right music and visuals





Questions and answers – part 1 of 2

Q: When making PowerPoint video, can we use transition effects?

A: Yes, all transitions and animations available in PowerPoint will play out in the video, according to the timings and order set in the original file.

Q: Isn't Moovly still free if you publish directly on YouTube?

A: It is possible only during the limited trial period.

Q: Can you insert images in free Biteable videos?

A: Yes, and there are many free templates for this.

Q. Can we use other languages in Biteable?

A.Yes, but test different typefaces to see which one looks best.

Q: Can we cut just a middle part of a song in Audio Cutter?

A: Yes, you can select a very specific part of a song, with exact duration you want.



Question and answers – part 2 of 2

Q: How to add the sound to a free Screencast-o-matic recording?

A: Record the audio in Windows Voice recorder, then combine the screencast and the audio file in DaVinci Resolve.

Q: Any tips on how to use smartphone to record videos at events?

A: Use full HD option for file size, record in horizontal, use a simple tripod or other way to stabilise the phone while recording, be aware of the background of your shots, and look for well-lit scenes.

Q: How to do the testimonial videos, so that we avoid the "talking heads"?

A: Record full interview, then cut and edit the most important parts, and overlay it with recordings of/from the project (concrete examples of what the interview is about).
