### Hackathon 1: Fight of illegal fishing

Fight against illegal fishing activities in the Mediterranean requires an efficient and responsible action of flag States in coordination with coastal, port and market States, to ensure an effective



























level playing field across the Mediterranean. Greater capacity, know-how and mutual understanding is in this respect required across all involved actors.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed): Support in the set-up of a Regional Academy for capacity building activities in the implementation of control obligations established under the GFCM.

# Hackathon 2: Aquaculture

Aquaculture is an increasing opportunity to sustain economic development across the Mediterranean as well as ensure accessible quality food. A number of challenges remains in this respect in order to boost innovation and diversification in existing practices and ensure greater economic return, quality production and environmental safety and security of existing and future aquaculture practices, particularly in the south.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed): *Improve* uptake of innovative aquaculture and sustainable small-scale fisheries (linked to innovation / advanced aquaculture production) in southern WestMED Countries.

### Hackathon 3: Marine Litter and plastic

Marine litter has become a major pollution problem affecting all of the world seas. Increased levels of marine litter originate largely from land-based activities and results in negative impacts on human health, marine wildlife, marine ecological systems, beach quality, and navigational safety, as well as fishing and maritime industries. A number of actions have been implemented to address this issue across the Mediterranean, while stronger focus could be put on the adoption of the "circular economy" concept in relation to the Blue Economy.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed):

 Boost small scale technologies for artisan solutions and energy production for collecting and reusing land-sea based plastic litter.

### Hackathon 4: Clean transport

Promoting the uptake of cleaner and more sustainable means of maritime transport by public and private operators is a strategic goal for the Mediterranean, so to boost the ability of the region to improve is economic performance by allowing zero impacts on tits vulnerable and valuable ecosystem. Recent evidence collected by Member States in the EU suggests an urgent need for greater policy efforts and concrete actions in this respect by all relevant stakeholders across the region.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed): Creation of a network of west med ports for LNG bunkering which can potentially connects East Med (Greece) to the entire region (up to Morocco), as a preliminary step to then discussing a « emission controlled area » for the entire region.

#### Hackathon 5: Maritime clusters

Cluster initiatives are essential mechanisms to ensure boosting of innovation and access to sustainable financing resources for the blue economy businesses and researchers at the local level. Currently a number of cluster initiative are active in the Mediterranean across the various activities related to the Blue Economy, often more developed in the Northern shore. And yet they lack of a common arena where sharing innovation challenges and opportunities and identify areas for knowledge/capacity transfer.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed): Creation of a north-south "peers" network – intended as an innovation-platform – for maritime (blue) clusters across the WestMed (and potentially beyond), to share good practices and boost development and cooperation amongst existing clusters (and emerging ones) across the region.

### Hackathon 6: Coastal and maritime tourism

Tourism is one of the larger Blue Economy activity in the Mediterranean, both terms of job generation and GVA. And yet the potentials for promoting more sustainable and innovative practices across the is enormous, including through the uptake of innovative business models,



























advanced technologies and the incubation and support for innovative start-ups. This is an area where greater cooperation and transfer of technologies and know-how from north to south can be supported.

Planned project ideas to be discussed during the Hackathon (to be further detailed): Acceleration of innovation and knowledge/technology transfer from north to south in tourism, so to support innovative SMEs and start-ups in the sector that generate local value.
