Subject:	ERDF/Cohesion Fund: indicators - Results of the work of the Evaluation Network

In view of the Structural Measures Working Party on 27 May, delegations will find attached a document prepared by the European Commission containing the results of the work of the Evaluation Network on the indicators concerning the ERDF/Cohesion Fund Regulation for the 2021-2027 period.

In line with the mandate given by the Austrian and Romanian Presidencies to conduct discussions at expert level with regard to the content of Annexes I and II of the ERDF/Cohesion Fund Regulation as well as the indicators reporting tables in Annex VII of the CPR in the Evaluation Network, the attached tables set out the outcome of those discussions.

For ease of reference and information purposes only, changes are shown in comparison with the original Commission proposals, taking account of changes introduced by the Council in the name and placing of specific objectives. This is without prejudice to the Commission's position on those changes.
