### **Outlines.**

With the new programming period the renowned calls for more integrated approach to sectoral and/or territorial policy implementation are being raised. In the meanwhile, the Commission through the Orientation Papers encourages a stronger cooperation between programmes operating within the same area(TN-CBC-including\_IPA, Interreg next). Working together, promoting common objectives and reinforcing synergies between programmes leads to a higher EU added value, a stronger impact in the area, a better allocation of public resources and improves the capacities of the programme authorities and beneficiaries. In this spirit and within this goal the Investment for Growth and Jobs programmes are encouraged as well to use cooperation more actively.

Interreg programmes operate in a specific territory/geographical area thus give response to territorial challenges. Based on this reality, improving synergies and intercoordination of the operations implemented by the most appropriate geographical scale can increase its efficiency when giving response to territorial challenges.

A dialogue between the programmes is, therefore, essential, to agree on challenges and type of actions /interventions. This should be addressed from an early stage of the programming, as a basis for long term coordination during the programme's implementation.

### **Objectives**

### OVERARCHING OBJECTIVE.

To reinforce the cooperation covered by the ETC regulation from the programming process to its implementation for a higher impact in the territory and efficiency while using public funds in the Mediterranean area.

To explore the need for a **coordination mechanism/solution** to address geographical and thematic challenges and build synergies.

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE.

Last June, during the first online meeting on Improving synergies across the Mediterranean, there was a focus on the WHAT, here there were updates on the Mediterranean programming task forces and the identification on possible common challenges. These tackled jointly, in a complementary way should be more efficient.

The second meeting focuses on WHO does what. To ensure programme inter-coordination all, Programme authorities, Commission and Member states have an active role. During this meeting Commission and Member States will take the opportunity to clarify/explain about their views to improve the synergies across programmes and programme authorities will explore their added value and discuss the type of operations they may finance \_based on their nature, TN, CBC,



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neighbourhood, pre-accession\_ to be more efficient reaching such complementarity. In this way striving to avoid overlaps and finance the same kind of operations.

To be more pragmatic, the idea of this second meeting will be collecting relevant information for the programmes to fill in section 1.2 and 2.1.2 of their Cooperation programmes.

### Methodology of the whole process.<sup>1</sup>

Organising an event online uses a different methodology than a physical one, this means that each meeting will not take more than 2 hours and only one objective will be tackled by each meeting. There are three meetings foreseen:

 The first meeting focuses on WHAT. During this session, the programmes operating in the Mediterranean will share information and identify their common challenges, common needs, based on each programme's territorial assessment. If possible, select 1 or 2

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possible common strategic themes to work on together. (Ex. ICZM, Sustainable Tourism, Plastic free sea....). 15 of June 2020. Online.

- 2. The second meeting focuses on WHO does what. To ensure programme inter-coordination Programme authorities should not be left alone. Commission and Member states have also a role in encouraging synergies across programmes and improving such coordination. During this meeting they will take the opportunity to explain it. On the other hand, programme authorities will explore their added value and discuss the type of operations they may finance in the most efficient way \_based on their nature, TN, CBC, neighbourhood, pre-accession\_ to achieve such complementarity. In this way striving to avoid overlaps and finance the same kind of operations.29th of September 2020. Online
- 3. The third meeting focuses on HOW to build a lasting cooperation and exchange. This will be achieved by reviewing the main difficulties when working on synergies with other programmes. During this session, programmes will identify suitable ways and levels of coordination and cooperation to improve complementarities across Interreg programmes working in the Mediterranean.
