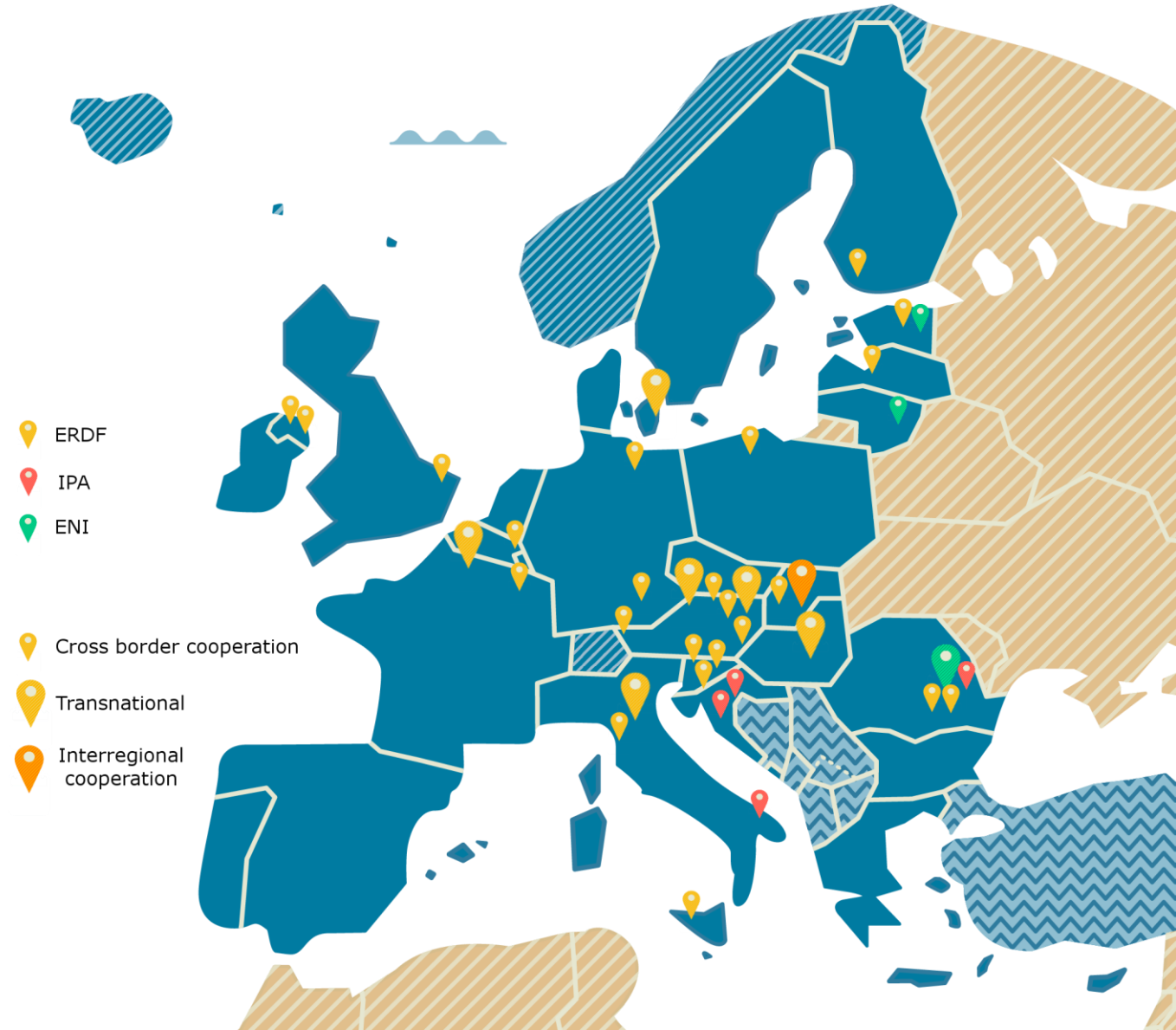


eMS – What did we achieve?

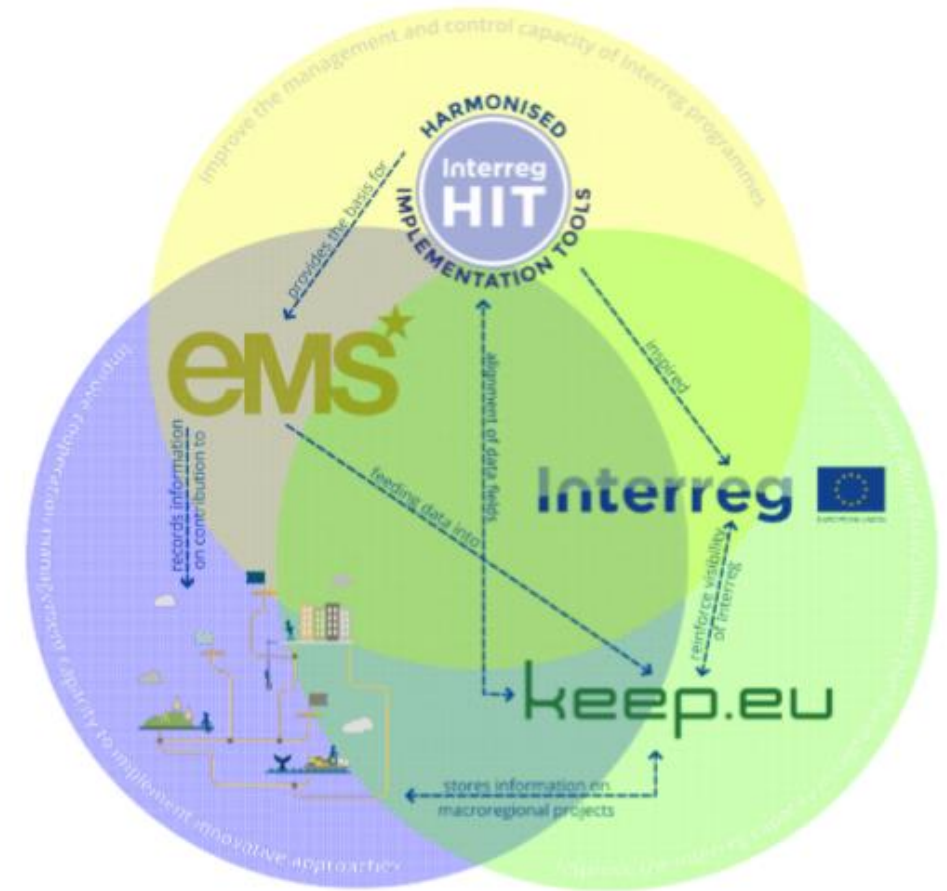
- 38 (+3) signed license agreements:

 - 4 IPA CBC programmes
 - 3 ENI CBC programmes
 - 2 interregional programmes
 - (3 non-Interreg programmes)

- Community – building



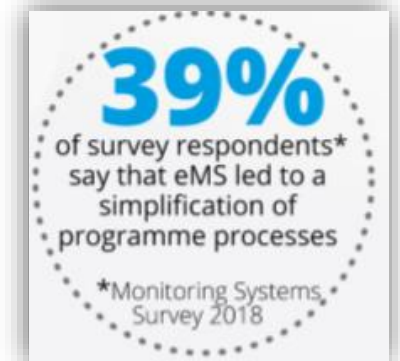
Through improved systems and tools

- Programme – specific plug-ins

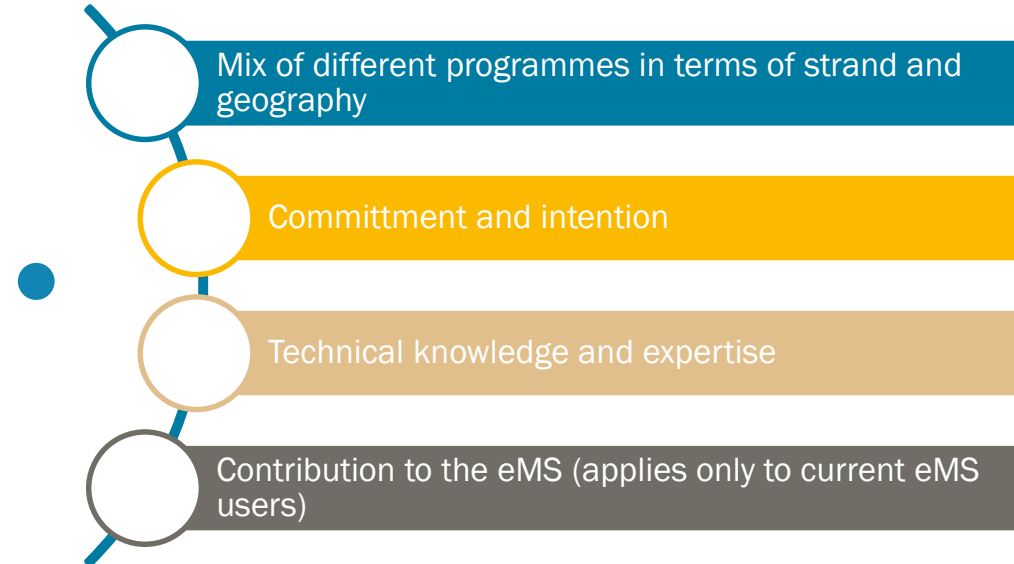
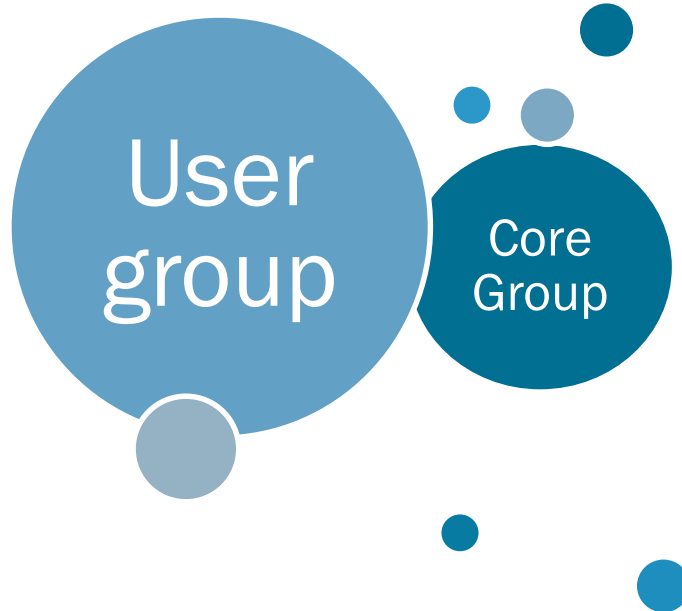


In programme authorities:

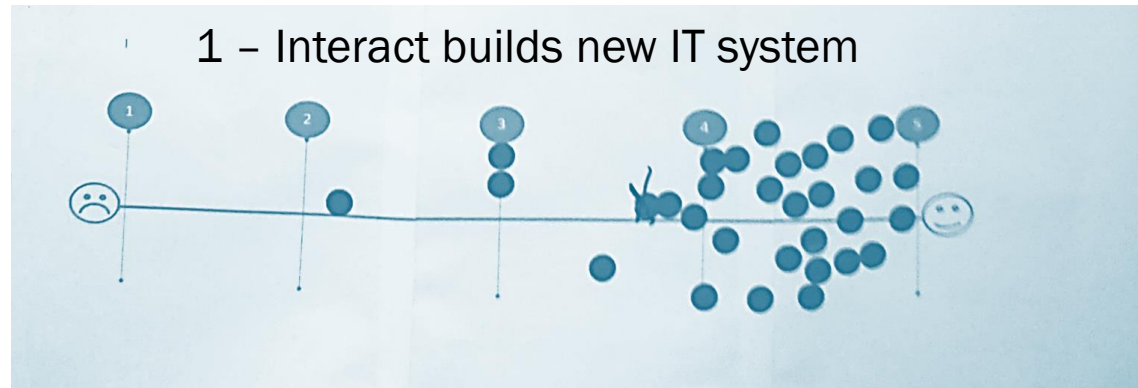
