What is it and why is it needed?

- 70% EU citizens live in cities
- 70% EU legislation implemented in cities
- 55% EU funds spent in cities
- 85% EU GDP generated in cities
- 7/10 Juncker priorities have urban dimension

=> Urban Agenda



What is it and why is it needed?

Objective: Include urban dimension in policies

- Work more on urban matters
- Work more with cities (eg. involve cities in the design)
- Mobilise cities in the delivery

Output: Action Plans for selected themes

- Actions (better legislation, better funding, better knowledge)
- Good projects to be scaled-up and transferred across the EU

Governance: Work in partnership

- EU (COM + EP + CoR + EESC)
- Member States
- Cities (e.g. Eurocities and CEMR)
- Stakeholders (experts, NGOs, business, etc.)

What is the political context?

Support by Member States

- Riga Declaration (2015)
- Pact of Amsterdam (foreseen May 2016) *under consultation*
- GAC conclusions endorsing Pact of Amsterdam (June 2016)

Support by the EP

- Westphal Report (2015)
- Regular meetings REGIO/ Urban Intergroup + MEPs

Support by the CoR

– Opinion (2015, Bas) + Opinion (2016, Dunger-Löper)

Support of EESC

- Opinion (2016, Haken)



What has been done so far?

- Reinforced coordination between DGs
- Work on 4 Partnerships
- Test of methods to improve the 'urban proofing'
- Commission urban website ('one-stop-shop')



What are the next steps?

- New Urban Agenda (Habitat III; October 2017)
- Secretariat for support to UA (January 2017)
- Online tool for the UA (January 2017)
- Launch of new Partnerships (early 2017)
- Report to the Council (end 2017)
- Cities Forum (end 2017)



Three other ambitious initiatives

Mapping of EU urban initiatives

- Have a more coherent approach:
- = Reinforce complementarities, avoid bottlenecks, build on synergies
- End 2016

One-stop-shop

- Single entry point for cities and stakeholders
- Complete reliable and customised information

Urban Innovative Actions

- Urban Lab of Europe
- Managed by COM and NPDC-Picardie
- 1st call launched (80 Mio)
- Projects start end 2016



Urban Innovative Actions



<u>Main features</u>

- Experimentation!
- € 370 M (2015-2020)
- 1 call per year on 3-4 topics (€ 50 M)
- > 50,000 inhabitants
- € 5 M ERDF max; 80%; 3 years
- 15-20 projects per year



1st call - Key Statistics

Number of application: 378

Avg amount of ERDF: EUR 3.75 million

Expected number of selected projects: 18-20

Breakdown of project proposals

- Jobs and skills- 124
- Energy Transition 113
- Urban Poverty 91
- $_{\odot}~$ Integration of Migrants and Refugees 50



2nd call - Topics of the second call

- € 50 Moi
- November 2016
- 3 topics:
 - Circular economy
 - Sustainable urban mobility
 - Inclusion of migrants and refugees



Other initiatives



ESIF for cities (2014-2020)

- ERDF: > half spent in cities (> € 100 B)
 → Article 7 : € 15 B managed directly by cities
- **ESF:** € 1,5 B to sustainable urban development
- **URBACT:** € 96 Mio
- Urban Innovative Actions: € 370 Mio
- **INTERREG Europe:** € 425 Mio (a lot for cities)
- **ESPON:** € 49 Mio (part for urban studies)
