### **Outlines**

EU macro-regional strategies (MRS)¹ were initiated by the political leaders of the countries and regions in Europe, aiming to address shared challenges that could not be dealt with sufficiently by a single country or a region. In addition, MRS were proposed to unite Europe and exploit opportunities building on the strength of geographically close territories. While the concept of MRS is generic, the context of MRS implementation differs.

MRS implementation is aiming to create long-term change and impact, and for it, MRS:

- address challenges from a cross-sectoral perspective,
- explore opportunities for alignment of resources (financial, human, institutional, legislative, etc.),
- · engage relevant stakeholders in macro-regional actions,
- and build coordinated implementation processes connecting policy objectives and activities on the ground.

However, MRS governance and implementation are not that straightforward. MRS require designing, aligning, engaging, and coordinating a variety of resources, stakeholders, and actions for the benefit of the entire macro-region. MRS framework is built on the principles of the "3 No's" (no new funds, no new institutions, no new legislation). And to achieve its objectives, MRS collaboration requires strong political commitment and recognition of the macro-regional collaboration value. The above raises the following questions: How do thematic coordinators ensure the implementation and governance of thematic areas? What practical experiences are there to share - what works and what does not? Is there a potential for further cross-MRS collaboration and joint developments? What can thematic coordinators learn from one another?

Having it in mind, the Interact Programme, in close collaboration with the EUSDR priority area 1B "Rail, road and air links" coordinator, is proposing a meeting of MRS Transport Coordinators with a particular focus on inland transport. This meeting will consider conclusions from the earlier two transport coordinators' meetings held in 2017.

### **Objectives**

The MRS Transport Coordinators meeting will have two main objectives:

- provide the space for open and informal exchange on MRS implementation and governance progress, practices and approaches, successes, and failures.
- exchange suggestions on further practical cross-MRS collaboration and enhanced political support and recognition of MRS implementation.

The meeting is divided into two parts. Day 1 is inviting thematic coordinators for the MRS and support units of the MRS to exchange practical MRS governance and implementation questions and to have the first discussion on potentials for cross-MRS further collaboration. Day 2 will be open to a wider group of participants, including DG REGIO and DG MOVE, mainly focussing on the role and place of MRS in the EU landscape (e.g. recognition of MRS in EU policies; possibilities for impacting EU legislative proposals) and to discuss options for improved cooperation.

### **Exchange on cross-MRS collaboration potential**

During this session, thematic area coordinators will be exchanging ideas about how MRS could contribute to policy-making in the transport field at the EU level and the potential for cross-MRS collaboration.

- MRS and their place in the EU policy landscape: how could the link between the MRS and EU policymaking be strengthened? What can MRS offer to support the implementation of the EU requirements? Is there a common and shared message that all MRS can convey to EU legislators (e.g. TEN-T directive, eFTI)?
- The energy crisis and how the MRS need to respond to support the energy transition in the transport and mobility system (data collection on energy consumption of transport, cross-sectoral and multi-stakeholder approaches, innovative technological approaches and digital solutions, use of renewable energy sources for transport, measures which target mobility patterns and demand). What could be the MRS role in the process and impact?
- Cross-MRS events and networks: potential for joining forces and mutual exchange (events: e.g. Danube Region Transport Days, potentials for cross-MRS networks).
- Potentials for projects to grow into cross-MR initiatives? How to exchange on such projects?

Objectives of the session: to elaborate proposals related to MRS contribution to EU policy-making in the transport field as well as to discuss options for further collaboration across MRS.
