DANUBEPARKS is the Network of Protected Areas along the Danube River, working together since 2009. It currently consists of 17 Protected Areas from 9 Danube countries, all hotspots for biodiversity.

We improve consistency of nature protection activities and strengthen our voice on European level. Our main fields of work include restoration of dynamic river habitats, floodplain forest & meadow management, protection and monitoring of rare species, and nature tourism.



The Danube River is a green lifeline for biodiversity. While the Network of Danube Protected Areas preserves the most valuable sites, habitat fragmentation limits efforts to preserve a cohesive ecosystem.

DANUBEparksCONNECTED has initiated the DANUBE HABITAT CORRIDOR campaign to counteract fragmentation. It offers Danube-wide strategies and exemplary pilot actions aiming to restore and maintain connectivity in all habitat elements:

- Water: The cross-sector Danube WILDIsland CORRIDOR program protects the islands, which are flagship habitats for intact river dynamics and home to characteristic species.
- Land: Natural river systems also host dry habitats, today often fragmented to isolated patches. Under DANUBE DRY HABITAT CORRIDOR pilot actions such as cross-border grazing herds to manage dry habitats and test the long-distance functionality of the habitat corridor or the establishment of

- **D) Go Strategic !!!** Anchor your results, go for policy.





SEE Photo Competition

The SEE Programme invited all institutions involved in the 122 SEE projects to participate in the SEE Photo Competition to show through one or several photos the cooperation activities and results that have been implemented and illustrate best the project topics. The aim was to capture the essence of a project through an image that would 'speak' to both stakeholders and the general public.

The submission of photos was open until April 2014 and an online voting system took place in May 2014. **104 photos were submitted by 37** projects (see all of them below). These photos received **584 online votes**.

After an online and jury voting process, the best 50 photos were selected to be displayed during the SEE Annual Event 2014 (Ljubljana 24-25/09).










