



The possible link among the goals of Cohesion Policy is one of the most challenging tasks of the European Structural and Investment Funds and article 96.3 (d) of Reg. (EU) No 1303/2013 is a concrete tool that allows cooperation activities in the 'Investment for growth and jobs (IGJ) goal' to all European regions.

In the framework of INTERACT activities of the follow-up to the study and seminar carried out on the use of article 37.6 (b) of Regulation (CE) No 1083/2006 until 2011, considering the encouragement stated by the European Commission in using the instrument of this article, given the interest showed by a number of European regions wanting to implement a closer cooperation and exchange between the opportunities offered in the framework of Cohesion Policy, also in close connection with actions implemented under the European Social Fund (ESF).
